EURACARE DONATES WHEELCHAIRS, HAND SANITIZERS AND MOSQUITO BED NETS TO OAFRICA GHANA

Euracare's Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) measures for the benefit of socioeconomic development with the relief and welfare of women and orphans. Another initiative taken by Euracare Ghana to support the United Nations Sustainable Goals 3, 4, 7, 8 and 9 was on the 20th of August 2020 at the Cerebral Palsy Branch of OAfrica in Adenta to donate 7 manual wheelchairs, hand sanitizers and mosquito bed nets. The Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all.











Cerebral palsy (CP) is characterized by reduced mobility and inability to maintain balance and correct posture. In Ghana, many families have children with cerebral palsy but with less than 200 physiotherapists working in the whole country, there are very limited opportunities for treatment. The donation goes a long way to benefit families with children with these disabilities.

OAfrica is a non-profit organization (NGO) developing schemes and projects to help vulnerable children and their families in Ghana, West Africa.

The organization was originally established as a local NGO in Ghana in 2002 and steadily grew internationally with registered branches in the United States where it is a 501 c3 non-profit, as well as France, Germany, Italy, Spain and Switzerland. The common goal of these branches is to rescue vulnerable children in need of care and to trace and reunite children with their families. These children are often separated from their families by poverty, the HIV/AIDs epidemic, and the increase of rural to urban migration.
